### Journey with Christ our Lord through Holy Week to Easter

Wherever you will celebrate Holy Week and Easter, these are very special days of grace for us all.



Christ Carrying the Cross, by Titian, painted around 1565 and now in the Museo del Prado, Madrid.

We see in close-up, Simon of Cyrene helping Jesus as he stumbles towards Calvary to die for us. The Cross both separates them and binds them. The Lord wears the crown of thorns, his face is bloodstained, and he is being led with a noose by invisible soldiers. As he looks tearfully towards us, the Lord seems to ask if we too are willing to accompany him and share his Cross.

The Lord is inviting you to relive his final days on this earth with him.

Beating at their heart is his immense love for you; let that thought touch you and you will be greatly rewarded. Holy Week should never feel like or be an ordinary week!

In Holy Week, reflect on the journey the Holy Spirit has guided you on during Lent this year, and whether any particular thing emerged for you – think and pray about that in these days, and give God thanks for it if you can. Is there also something for which you may still wish to seek the grace of God's forgiveness, as you celebrate Christ's Passion? Offer your prayers in solidarity with the suffering people of Gaza, being unjustly oppressed so near to the places of Jesus' life and death.

At <u>Holy Thursday's evening Mass of the Lord's Supper (8pm)</u> we celebrate again how Jesus, at his final meal on earth, instituted the Eucharist and the Priesthood. We solemnly celebrate this Banquet of Love, that is the heart of every Mass. Give thanks for those gifts of grace which help you follow the Lord more faithfully. Pray for your priests, and encourage priestly vocations among your own sons.

On <u>Good Friday at 3pm</u>, guided by the Passion according to Saint John, we accompany Christ on his sorrowful journey to the Cross on which he died; we will venerate the image of his Cross; and, receiving his Body and Blood in Holy Communion, contemplate his love poured out for us and the world as he died.

On Good Friday morning at 10am, there are Stations of the Cross for all, especially for children and their families.

On <u>Good Friday</u>, the special Papal COLLECTION for THE 'HOLY PLACES' is taken – it helps support Christian Churches and Communities in the Holy Land (including Gaza), where our brothers and sisters live in such peril,

caught in the conflict between Arab and Israeli. **Please be generous:** those who take envelopes should have one especially for this; you can also use the Card Readers.

On <u>Good Friday</u>, <u>Catholics offer the Lord two final acts of Lenten penance</u>, by <u>Fasting and Abstinence</u> – let these small sacrifices remind us of how great is Christ's sacrifice for us.

What is required from us? Adults up to the age of 65 (and all who can) fast by eating <u>only one main meal</u> and <u>abstain from any meat</u> throughout the day (vegetarians should adapt appropriately). We are only obliged to undertake these small penances twice a year: on Good Friday and Ash Wednesday, to begin and conclude Lent.

The Easter Celebration of Christ's Resurrection begins with the Easter Vigil next Saturday evening at 9pm. This is the great Easter Service. As night begins to fall, the light of Christ risen (symbolised by our Paschal Candle) guides us into the darkened Church towards new life. By the light of the Paschal Candle we will pray, sing and keep silence, reliving the great story of how God prepared his chosen people for wonders that are surpassed by the Resurrection of Our Lord from the dead. If you possibly can, come to this special service rather than other Easter Masses.

On Easter Day there are two Masses, at the usual morning times (9am and 11am), but NO EVENING MASS.

'On Pilgrimage' from Easter to Pentecost in our Parish and Diocese

#### Immediately after Easter in our Parish:

- At 11am Mass on Sunday 27 April Canon Gerard Bradley will be coming to Confirm our 11 candidates.
- On Thursday May 1<sup>st</sup> at 7pm: we are holding a Reconciliation Service (Confessions) it is available for all, but especially the children who will receive their first Holy Communion.
- A local Jubilee Walking Pilgrimage with people from neighbouring parishes on Saturday 10 May, starting here or at Holy Ghost Parish Church. A sign-up sheet is available at the back of Church. En route there will be Mass at Holy Ghost at 10am, Adoration at Sacred Heart, Lunch at Our Lady of Mount Carmel, and Evening Prayer and Refreshments here in the early afternoon.
- First Holy Communions will be celebrated at 11am Mass on Sunday 11 May.

As part of the Jubilee Year in our Southwark Diocese, there will be a big outdoor Celebration for the whole diocese, a **Jubilee Day at The Friars**, **Aylesford on Saturday 7 June** from **10.30 am - 4.30 pm** in the grounds of the Priory.

Sign Up now at the back of Church: A coach has been reserved by our Parish in the hope that sufficient people wish to go, so you must book early - cost £30 for adults and £10 for children/under 18s. June 7<sup>th</sup> will be a day of fun and faith for all the family: talks, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, Confessions, Prayer for Healing, exhibitions and fun activities for children, as well as the joy of just being outside relaxing in this beautiful historic place.

People are encouraged to bring your own picnics, but food, including a barbecue, a tea room and ice creams will be available on site (though probably with long queues). The day will culminate in a **concelebrated Mass led by Archbishop John**, who will pray a special blessing on all those present and on the whole diocese.

In the weeks of preparation between Easter and Pentecost, our Diocese is offering a six-session course 'Pilgrimage to Pentecost', to help deepen our understanding of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Sessions will comprise pre-recorded talks, a faith testimony, and music accessible via YouTube, and an opportunity to share with others online or in person. We hope the course booklet will be available very soon. If you would like to set up a group, please let us know.

The booklet will have meditations for every day between Divine Mercy Sunday until the week after Pentecost. You can follow this course on your own at home, join a group in the Parish, or join an Online Group. Currently, two groups at St Vincent's have been proposed, but if you would like to host another please see Father Tim. One group will be meeting on Wednesday evenings (contact Stuart Edwards <a href="ste7474@icloud.com">ste7474@icloud.com</a>) and another on Wednesday mornings 9.30 am - 11 am (contact Kristina Cooper, as above). ### Intentions for our Prayer

Pray for Peace in the many other troubled places across our world including: Afghanistan, Armenia and Azerbaijan, Cameroun, Chad, China, Colombia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Haiti, Hong Kong, Mali, Myanmar, Nigeria, Russia, Sudan, Thailand, Yemen.... and all the other places where the innocent are caught up in the violent power struggles of others.

And for the many Christians who in so many parts of the world continue to face persecution for their faith in Jesus Christ, the incarnate Son of God.

For the many victims of the earthquake in Myanmar and for an end to the Burmese government's violence against its own people.

Pray for the recovery to health of Pope Francis. Join him in his April Prayer Intention – for the use of new technologies: 'Let us pray that the use of the new technologies will not replace human relationships, will respect the dignity of the person, and will help us face the crises of our times.'

For our young people preparing for Confirmation at the end of the month, and the children preparing for First Holy Communion in May; and that in the future their families will continue to support their growth in faith and attendance at Mass.
